Purpose of SBB

- To also allow child to proceed at a pace he/she can manage for his/her weaker subjects.
- To provide more flexibility to students with strengths and abilities that vary across subjects
- Every child will be encouraged to do subjects at the level that best meets his/her abilities



Standard vs Foundation Subject

- Foundation subjects <u>focus on mastery of core content</u> and <u>skills</u>. These are pitched at a <u>lower level</u> as compared to the corresponding standard subject.
- Students should take subjects that would <u>best maximise</u> their potential and <u>not go for softer option</u> as this will affect students' chances of going into the Express or N(A) courses in secondary school





At P4

School recommends a subject combination based on P4 examination results. Parents select preferred combination.

At P5

Student takes subject combination chosen by parents.

Your child will be recommended to take
• 4 standard subjects





School recommends a subject combination based on P4 examination results. Parents select preferred combination.

At P4

If your child (at the end of P4)

Passes all 4 subjects and performs very well in Mother Tongue Language

Your child will be recommended to take

 4 standard subjects + Higher Mother Tongue Language





School recommends a subject combination based on P4 examination results. Parents select preferred combination.

At P4

If your child (at the end of P4)

Passes 2 subjects or less

Your child will be recommended to take

- 3 standard subjects +
 1 other foundation subject; or
- 2 standard subjects +
 2 other foundation subjects; or
- 1 standard subject +
 3 other foundation subjects; or
- 4 foundation subjects

End of P5

Student takes a subject combination determined by the school

Students who do not meet expectations

Switch some subjects to Foundation level



Exercising Parental Option

- Parental option is given only <u>once</u> at the <u>end-of-year at</u>
 <u>P4</u> for the course of study.
- Parents <u>should not</u> go for soft option (choosing foundation subjects when the child passes the exams) – it will affect the Course in Secondary School later on
- Subsequent movement at end of P5 for P6 will be based solely on your <u>child's performance</u> and the <u>school's decision</u>.





Guiding Principles in Recommending and Deciding Subjects Offered at End of P4 and P5



SBB allows each student to develop and learn at their own pace.



Student's recent performance in SA2, WAs, performance over the years in the subjects, teachers' observations and comments are considered.





Tips for Exercising Your Option

Subject combination that <u>matches your child's</u> <u>capability</u>,

NOT

What your other children were capable of What you want of your child Where your child's friends are

HMTL - Considerations

- Extra 1 hour per week taught outside curriculum time.
- Students will sit for **BOTH** MTL & HMTL papers.
- School will recommend students who are able to cope with HMTL at the end of the year





HMTL – Considerations

Consider your child's interest and ability

- Is the child <u>performing very well</u> in the language?
- Does your child <u>enjoy</u> the language?
- How is the child's <u>performance in other subjects</u>?
- Will your child be able to <u>manage the time and demands</u>?
 (e.g. weekly HMTL additional lessons in the afternoon, remedial/enrichment/supplementary lessons, CCAs)





HMTL - Considerations


Option to take HMTL is given only <u>once</u> at the <u>end-of-year at</u>
 P4


• Subsequent movement at end of P5 for P6 will be based solely on your <u>child's performance</u> and the <u>school's decision</u>.

 Results for HMTL will <u>NOT</u> be used for calculation of the PSLE aggregate score.



Using HCL for Admission into SAP Schools





Students with **better PSLE scores** will be posted first, even if they do not take HCL

Among students with the same **PSLE scores**. those with **better HCL grades** will be posted first






% PASS RATE
